ABOUT MOUNT HERMON

Named for the highest peak in Israel in northern Golan Heights, Mount Hermon wines over-deliver on quality, flavor and affordability.

THE WINE

Mount Hermon Indigo is produced from a blend of Cabernet Sauvignon and Syrah (Shiraz) fruit harvested from vineyards on the Golan Heights. These two classic red varieties combine to give the wine its appealing indigo color. This medium-bodied red blend features attractive characters of ripe red and black fruits, intermingled with notes of smoke, earth, black tea and fresh herbs. Ready to drink upon release, the Mount Hermon Indigo is best enjoyed within about three years from harvest.

PAIRING

Serve this versatile wine with grilled lamb skewers, a good steak or a wild mushroom thin-crust pizza.



ABOUT THE GALILEE APPELLATION

The Galilee (or Galil) is the northernmost — and generally considered



the best — appellation in Israel. The highest quality growing area within the appellation is the Golan Heights (or simply the Golan), also the coldest region in Israel. The vineyards on this volcanic plateau rise from 1,300 feet to 3,900 feet above sea level and receive snowfall in the winter. Golan Heights Winery is located in the town of Katzrin in the central Golan.
