ABOUT MOUNT HERMON

Named for the highest peak in Israel in northern Golan Heights, Mount Hermon wines over-deliver on quality, flavor and affordability.

THE WINE

Mount Hermon Rosé is produced from a unique blend of Syrah, Tempranillo, Tinta Cao and Pinot Noir harvested from our vineyards on the Golan Heights. This medium-bodied, blended rosé exhibits an aromatic mix of strawberry, raspberry, grapefruit and red apple fruit characters, complemented by notes of baking spices. Pleasantly approachable and drinkable now, Mount Hermon Rosé is best enjoyed within a few years of vintage.

PAIRING

Serve this versatile wine with pan-roasted chicken with citrus sauce, grilled bass with summer fruit salsa, or roasted beet salad with goat cheese and walnuts.

ABOUT THE GALILEE APPELLATION

The Galilee (or Galil) is the northernmost — and generally considered the best — appellation in Israel. The highest quality growing area within the appellation is the Golan Heights (or simply the Golan), also the coldest region in Israel. The vineyards on this volcanic plateau rise from 1,300 feet to 3,900 feet above sea level and receive snowfall in the winter. Golan Heights Winery is located in the town of Katzrin in the central Golan.
