Golan Heights' cooler climate, rocky volcanic soil, and high altitude are ideal growing conditions for Chardonnay and Sauvignon Blanc. Cold fermentation helps to preserve the fruit's vibrant profile. This medium-bodied white blend displays aromatic notes of tangerine, lime, green apple and tropical fruits with hints of spices and flowers, making the wine refreshing, lively and easy to enjoy. Ready to drink now, Mount Hermon White is best enjoyed within two years of harvest.

### ABOUT THE GALILEE APPELLATION

The Galilee (or Galil) is the northernmost — and generally considered the best — appellation in Israel. The highest quality growing area within the appellation is the Golan Heights (or simply the Golan), also the coldest region in Israel. The vineyards on this volcanic plateau rise from 1,300 feet to 3,900 feet above sea level and receive snowfall in the winter. Golan Heights Winery is located in the town of Katzrin in the central Golan.
